



## AERIAL PIPELINE ABANDONMENT REACHES NEW HEIGHTS

## MARINE CONSTRUCTION Project Highlight







**PROJECT:** Aerial Pipeline Dismantlement

**LOCATION:** Wax Lake Outlet, Atchafalaya Bay, Louisiana

WORK SCOPE: Lower super structure; removal of 22" diameter pipeline at 73' above sea level, removal of inverted internally braced "Y" towers.

## **CHALLENGES OVERCOME**

- » Erected in the 1970's, this was the first aerial of its kind to be removed in the US
- » Restrictive access preventing heavy equipment transportation over the levees
- » High velocity currents
- » Both shallow and deep (100') water depth contours
- » Instable weather conditions
- » Unsprung energy storage
- » Workers at height restrictions (Installation methods were 40 years old)
- » Environmental concerns
- » Close proximity to other buried and aerial pipelines
- » Boat traffic during day and night

Chet Morrison Contractors was contracted to develop a solution that met stringent regulatory and safety requirements. A major key to the safe and successful completion of this ground breaking project was the meticulous planning of the work and the proactive client/contractor partnership.
